Sunday, June 09, 2024


The Otipemisiwak Métis Government's Environment and Climate Change Department is pleased to bring another Traditional Plant Walk to our District again!



CELEBRATE YOUR MOM


Sunday, May 12, 2024

OUR CITIZEN'S REPRESENTATIVE

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Grant Lacombe, and I am proud to be the Otipemisiwak Métis Government of the Métis Nation within Alberta Citizens' Representative for Lesser Slave Lake Métis District 21. I have been asked what I have been working on since being elected. Following the swearing-in, I had the pleasure of visiting some communities, such as, Faust, Sunset House, and Swan Hills, just to name a few. It's been great connecting with familiar faces and meeting new people.



I was also honoured that President Sandmaier appointed me as Secretary of Harvesting and Culture. Hunting, fishing, and trapping has been a major part of my life. I have had the opportunity to travel to advocate and look forward to putting forward legislation for Citizens' Council's consideration at a future date related to the outdoors. I was also proud to be appointed to the Legislative Proposal Assessment Committee.

I have been asked about the transition process, and I can assure you that progress is being made. Moving from Locals and Regions to Districts is a long process with many moving parts. There is a lot of work taking place behind the scenes and I want to thank all the staff involved for their hard work.

This could not have been done without the hard work of the talented people at the Slave Lake Local #19. I will update you as soon as we have a firm date for the Special Meeting.

I also want to express my heartfelt condolences to the families of Herb Anderson, Clarence Norris, and Fred Auger. All three knowledge keepers lived long and fulfilling lives. Many of us knew them well, and I share in your grief.


MNA FREE DENTAL CLINIC IN DISTRICT 21




