

IT'S BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH TIME TO GET SCREENED

A mammogram can help identify abnormal cells early, making cancer more treatable and improving health outcomes. Women between the ages of 45 and 74 are advised to have a mammogram every two years.

Depending on your personal or family cancer history, you may need to begin cancer screening earlier than the recommended age guidelines. Take to your family doctor about cancer screening to determine what is right for you.

This powerful symbol represents our community's journey towards truth, healing, and reconciliation. The day was filled with emotions as we reflected on the lasting impacts of residential schools while coming logether to hance the survivors and the children who never made it home.
