
YOUTH SUCCESS STORY IN OUR DISTRICT





START A BUSINESS: OPEN A DAY HOME

January 10, 2025

The Day Home Startup Pilot Program is offered by the Children & Family Services Team at the Otipemisiwak Métis Government. Access to Métis centred child care helps to ensure that Métis children and their families develop a sense of belonging, build strength and resilience through culture, foster community connections, and preserve language and cultural practices.

Through this program, we will connect with Métis citizens interested in opening and operating licensed day homes in their communities, support them in navigating the day home licensing process, provide financial assistance with startup costs, and provide guidance in Métis cultural readiness through Métis Cultural Awareness training and resources


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LAST MONTH AT A GLANCE

TRACKING CARIBOU

January 02 to 05, 2025

Our Métis citizens recently trekked deep into the forest for an important Caribou Monitoring trip, observing the land, wildlife, and ecosystem to assess the well-being of our caribou population. $\Box \sigma^{n} \Box$



□Our Métis ancestors have always lived in harmony with the land and the animals we share it with. This knowledge continues to be passed down, ensuring future generations can maintain our connection to the land and the caribou that have sustained our people for centuries.

A huge thank you to the dedicated citizens who braved the cold, explored the landscape, and contributed to this vital monitoring project. Your work is helping to protect our lands, our wildlife, and our future. Between January 02 to 05, 2025, the assembled team carefully tracked footprints in the snow, examined caribou food sources, and scouted for signs of movement to understand how our four-legged relations are thriving in our traditional lands. The information gathered will help guide conservation efforts and ensure that these incredible animals have the resources they need to survive.




