

Born and mostly raised in Slave Lake, Chana has deep roots in our region, growing up surrounded by Métis culture alongside her parents and grandmother. Her parents and grandmother planted strong seeds of culture, pride, and community leadership that she carries forward every day.

Chana is the visionary behind Truly Creative Marketing, an Indigenous, women-owned business that helps others bring their visions to life.



Her incredible journey has earned her national recognition, most recently, she is currently nominated for Canadian Indigenous Entrepreneur of the Year with Canadian SME Magazine. In the last year, Chana was a Finalist for AWE Indigenous Entrepreneur of the Year, and a finalist for the Pow Wow Pitch Entrepreneur Awards. She was also featured in a 3 page Article in Indigenous SME Magazine and received a heartfelt letter of congratulations from Canada's Minister of Small Business.

But her story doesn't stop there. Currently, Chana is creating, teaching, and facilitating the LIFT Program (Learning Indigenous Financial Teachings), delivering financial literacy workshops to Indigenous women, girls, and 2S individuals within our District. This powerful program brings meaningful, accessible financial knowledge to our rural communities—empowering participants to take control of their financial futures 💸 🐇

Chana is a proud neurodivergent entrepreneur who advocates for inclusivity in all spaces. She works hard to overcome her disabilities in creative ways while embracing the motto of "Always Learning." She teaches both modern and traditional Métis art such as beading and dot art painting with District 21, is a loving wife and proud mama, and continues to uplift our community in every space she steps into.

March 31, 2025 - Ongoing Program by OMG


The Psychology Benefit Program, Ni Natoohtaan, provides financial support to Métis Citizens accessing care with psychologists or social workers for longer-term and complex mental health needs. In partnership with Alberta Blue Cross, we are excited to offer a modern, best-in-class psychology benefit program.

If you are currently seeing a licensed Psychologist or Social Worker, you may be eligible to receive financial coverage for 12 sessions.

The next applications period will open on April 14, 2025, and will remain open until all program spots have been filled. Applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis and you will be contacted by an MNA staff member to confirm your enrollment.




TRADITIONAL METIS DANCE NIGHTS



On March 28, 2025, Métis District 21 hosted our Legacy of Resilience Workshop, a heartfelt and healing day dedicated to our Indian Residential School and Day School Survivors.

This intimate gathering welcomed invited



participants to engage in nearing and reflection, supported by cultural teachings, storytelling, and meaningful activities. Each participant received a workbook to guide their journey—facilitated with compassion by Lorna Dancey—and had the option to complete it at their own pace.









Jamie Chalifoux shared his powerful experience of growing up as the child of Residential School Survivors, while Chana Trudel offered space for expression through sand garden art therapy—a beautiful and calming creative outlet.

To close the day, James Cardinal led the group in learning two songs in English and Cree, lifting spirits and voices. Participants also received massage and movement therapy by Yvonne Dicristafaro, and had a moving portrait captured by the talented Brooke Fontanet of Copper Creek Photography. 
